





The University of Iowa College of Public Health (CPH) is part of a major research university and serves as a comprehensive public health resource for the state of Iowa, the Midwest region, and the nation. The college, founded in 1999, offers training leading to bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees as well as combined degree options. A wide array of programs ranging from aging studies to zoonotic diseases allows students to explore diverse areas of interest.

The College of Public Health takes pride in its multidisciplinary, collaborative approach to addressing public health challenges and training the next generation of public health leaders, educators, and researchers.

COLLEGE OF PUBLIC HEALTH Distinctions

- The CPH is ranked among the top 10 publicly supported colleges of public health, according to U.S. News and World Report. Its Department of Health Management and Policy is ranked number 5 and Department of Biostatistics is ranked number 7 among similar programs at publicly supported universities.
- The college is fully accredited by the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH) and is Iowa's only accredited school of public health.
- CPH faculty are recognized by their peers as leading scholars and experts in their disciplines. Faculty are members and fellows in many organizations, including the National Academy of Medicine, American College of Healthcare Executives, and American Statistical Association.
- The College of Public Health Building has achieved Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Platinum certification, the highest standard for sustainable design.



- The college's Undergrad to Grad combined degree program allows incoming undergraduates to earn both a bachelor's and master's degree in five years.
- The CPH offers a world-class education with a personal touch, including small class sizes, hands-on learning experiences, active student organizations, and a committment to interprofessional education.
- The CPH offers academic excellence at an affordable price. A variety of financial assistance, in the form of fellowships, scholarships, traineeships, and teaching and research assistantships, is available.
- Three Collective Areas of Excellence—Rural Health, Comparative Effectiveness Research, and Community Engagement—inform collegiate growth and innovation in research, academics, and outreach.
- The University of Iowa is named a "Best Buy" in the 2018 Fiske Guide to Colleges—one of only 20 public universities on the list.

The College of Public Health, with more than 25 interdisciplinary centers, fosters a vibrant, multidisciplinary research program. CPH investigators secured \$38.1 million in external funding for public health research in fiscal year 2017.

A special emphasis is given to rural public health issues, including agricultural safety and health, environmental health, occupational health, zoonotic infectious disease, health and aging, community-based nutrition and childhood obesity prevention, health communication, and organization of health care in rural settings.

Graduate students may qualify for research assistantships, take part in research-based internships or practicum experiences, or conduct original research as part of their studies.


