MPH Practical Experience

All MPH degree students develop skills in basic public health concepts and demonstrate a capacity to apply these concepts through a practical experience relevant to their area of specialization. The practical experience is an applied, field-based requirement that gives students experience in the practice of public health requiring depth (120-240 hours in a field placement) and breadth (one experience per month) — including participation in short-term volunteer opportunities and participation in on- or off-campus learning opportunities.

Integrative Learning Experience

The integrative learning experience (ILE) is the culminating requirement for MPH students. The integrative learning experience can be coordinated with the field-based practical experience requirement.
