



## Iowa Summer Institute in Biostatistics (ISIB)



## **Program Information**

The objective of the lowa Summer Institute in Biostatistics (ISIB) is to provide biostatistical training and applied research opportunities to undergraduates. Priority for admission and support will be given to underrepresented minorities and disadvantaged students from small liberal arts colleges without a substantial statistical curriculum. Undergraduate junior or senior students with math or biological sciences backgrounds are encouraged to apply.

The ISIB will be 7 weeks: instruction will be through case based instruction of real biomedical research; computer laboratory training; projects; and clinical and translational research enrichment activities.

Coursework will focus on clinical trials, translational research and models used in the analysis of biomedical studies. In addition, the course will serve as a fundamental building block for students to understand the field of biostatistics.

A week into the program, students will be matched with a Biostatistics faculty member and graduate research assistant for their research projects. The projects will give students exposure to research and opportunities to see medical science in action through biostatistics. After the supervised research, students present their accomplished research to faculty and students.

Students will be provided roundtrip transportation, meals and housing, and tuition for the 3 s.h. course.
